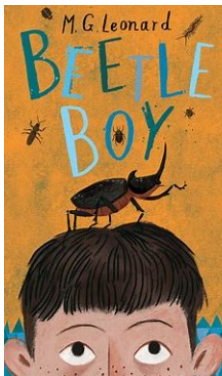

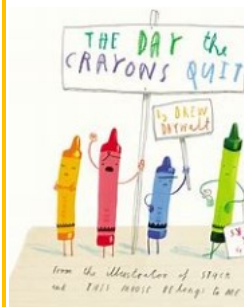
Teacher Recommendations

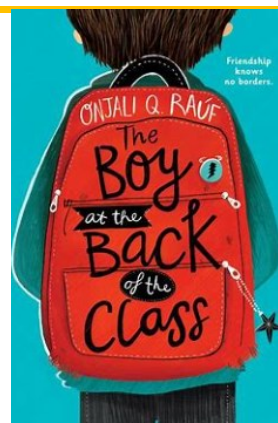
Miss Price recommends...

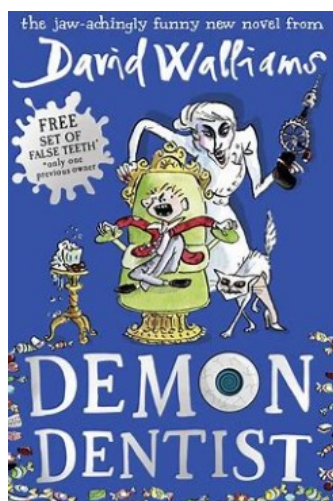
Book Recommendations from our Reading Ambassadors



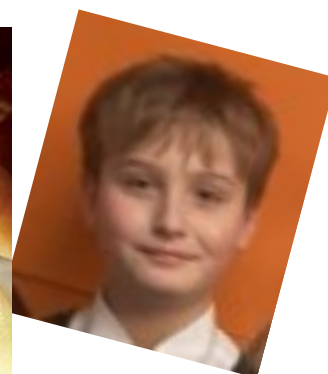
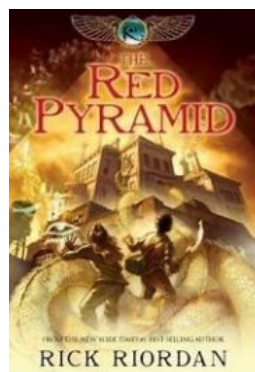

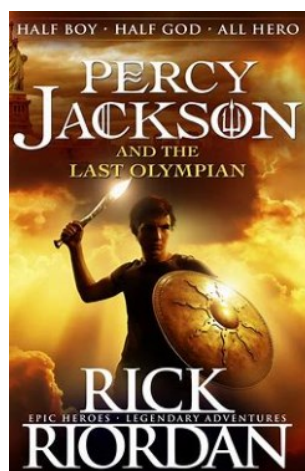
Isabella: I really like this book: It's interesting. Anyone who loves scary books, this is for you! I recommend this for anyone aged 9.



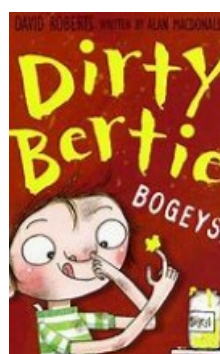
Jessica: I love this book. It's interesting and really funny. It also leaves you on a cliff hanger, which I love! I recommend this for Year 2+.



Ryan: If you're interested in history, especially the Egyptians, you'll love this book. The mystery and collaboration of the myth and modern world will keep you entertained.



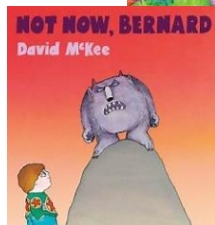
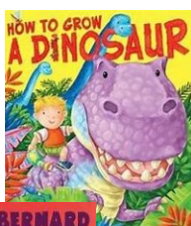
Harry: I love Percy Jackson books—they're a perfect mix of modern and myth. If you enjoyed learning about the Greeks in Year 4, you'll like this!

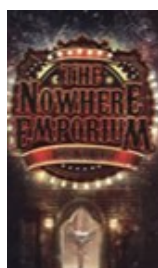
